

Temple Judea's Lights Giant Menorah For Hanukah

On Friday, December 11 at 7:15pm, Temple Judea of Manhasset will be lighting their nine-foot tall menorah on the front lawn to commemorate the first night of Hanukah, the Jewish festival of lights. The temple is located at the corner of Seasingtown Road and the Long Island Expressway service road and will have thousands of drivers observing it over the holidays.

"We started this tradition last year with the donation of the hanukiah by one of our temple families the Goodman-Wolinetz families," said Stu Horowitz, president of Temple Judea of Manhasset.
